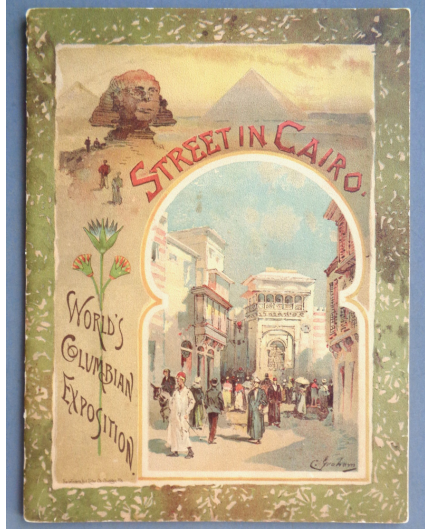

1. This is an *Absentee Auction*. There is an online catalog with color pictures. There is a printed version available, however it has black and white pictures. 2. **Auction Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday, September 17th, 2024 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

Timed lot closing: 10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes. When the 10 minutes has passed and no bid has been placed, that lot will sell to the highest bidder.



The First World's Fair held in the United States. The New York Crystal Palace was located on 5th Avenue and 42nd Street, also known as Bryant Park.
