2. **Auction Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday, January 14th, 2025 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

**Timed lot closing:** 10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes.
